LENTEN REGULATIONS:

- ◆ ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY are days of fast and abstinence.
- ◆ ALL FRIDAYS OF LENT are days of abstinence. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast; those 14 and older are obliged to abstain.
- ◆ ABSTINENCE means no meat; FASTING means one full meal—two lesser meals are allowed and only liquids between meals
